PAVING PROJECT—HIGHWAY MB

The Kenosha County Highway Department will be paving County Highway MB from Highway 50 South to County Highway C with plans to resurface County Highway MB sometime this summer. The County will provide a one week notice prior to resurfacing. This schedule can change depending on other emergency priorities.

The point to note is that it is not a guarantee that a particular road segment will be resurfaced even if it is on schedule. These resurfacing works will only have lane closures and the roads will be open to traffic at all times.

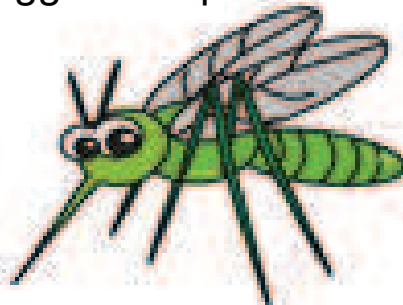

MOSQUITO CONTROL

The Village of Bristol will once again be conducting the mosquito control program for the 2017 season. You may see our Public Works truck in your neighborhood driving slow and spraying a natural pesticide to control mosquitoes. Spraying is done shortly before dusk. The pesticide used is ONLY dangerous to the mosquitoes—not humans or animals.

- The spray truck will be traveling less than 15 mph.
- It cannot be raining and the air temperature must be above 65 degrees for best results.
- Winds must be less than 10 mph.
- The pesticide only works when the mosquitoes are in flight.
- Spraying will be done on a weekly basis over a two night period.

Residents are asked to please remove any standing water in your yards. The standing water serves as a perfect breeding ground for mosquitoes to lay their eggs and spawn a new batch of mosquitoes.

Re: Increased Emergency Vehicle Traffic on Village Streets

Dear Sir or Madam,

We hope that this message finds you very well and having a very safe and enjoyable late spring/early summer.

As the ongoing construction along the U.S. Highway 45 corridor has progressed, you may have noticed responding Department apparatus and vehicles traversing some of our community's side streets and quieter roadways. For safety reasons, we typically prefer to utilize the Village's more expansive north/south and east/west County and State highways, including U.S. Highway 45, for emergency responses. The limited access afforded during the current phase of construction has presented a unique challenge to our crews in ensuring a timely response direct to locations south of County Highway C. For this reason, you may have observed Department apparatus and vehicles transiting the construction zone to determine daily access restrictions.

The construction is planned to proceed north to the area between 82nd Street and 86th Street in the weeks ahead; this phase is currently projected to be completed in November 2017. During this period, you may see elevated emergency vehicle traffic on 83rd Street, 198th Avenue and County Highway D (184th Avenue). Please be assured that our crews will be exercising an abundance of caution while responding through these areas to ensure the safety of our neighbors.

As a reminder, please avoid use of U.S. Highway 45 during construction. The effective work zone presents hazards to both travelers and construction crews, and additional, unnecessary traffic can inhibit safe and timely responses to emergencies.

We sincerely appreciate your patience and consideration as we step closer to an improved U.S. Highway 45. Please feel free to contact the fire station's non-emergency line at 262-857-2711 with any Department-related questions or concerns, and we welcome you to stop by the fire station during early evenings or weekends to see your community's emergency services personnel and equipment. In the event of an emergency, please do not hesitate to dial 911 immediately!

We are very proud to be afforded the opportunity to serve you, and stay safe!

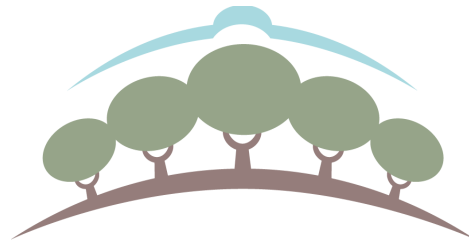
