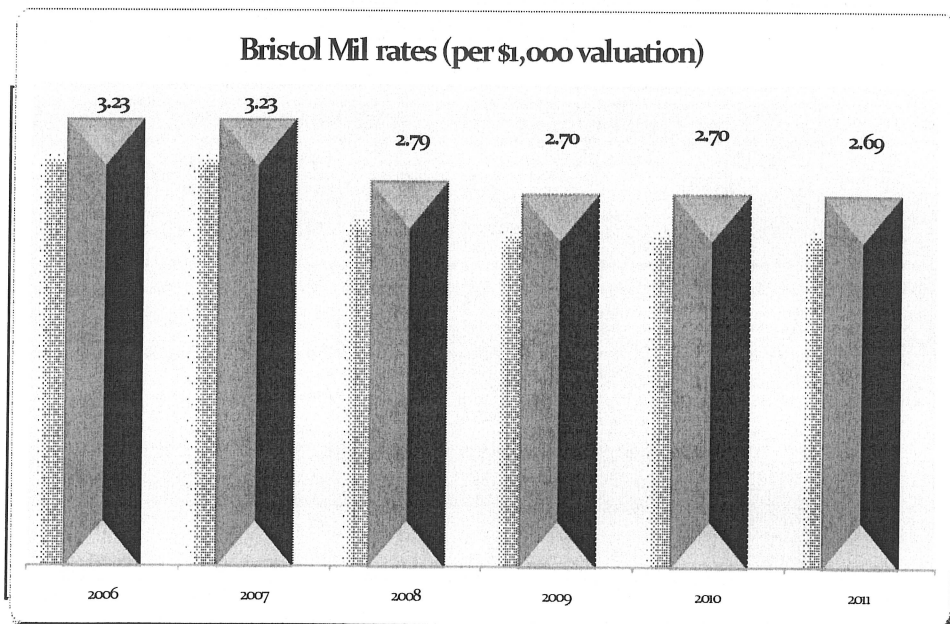

The Bristol Department of Public Safety is proud to team up with the Town of Salem Department of Public Safety and co-host a Safety Day for the citizens of its districts. "Green Up Your Yard" Workshops

The Root-Pike Watershed Initiative Network, in partnership with UW-Extension, will offer six workshops. The workshops are free and open to the public.

Since 2008, Root Pike WIN has funded 73 rain gardens in Kenosha, Racine, Milwaukee and Waukesha counties. Together the gardens are holding and infiltrating nearly 700,000 gallons of rainwater and snow-ice melt annually, thereby keeping it out of the streets and storm sewers where it carries pollutants such as yard chemicals, pet waste, car fluids and yard waste untreated to our streams, rivers and lakes.

Funding for rain garden grants has been provided by the SC Johnson Fund, E.C Styberg Foundation, Freshwater Future, Michigan State University and the Great Lakes Protection Fund, Southeastern Wisconsin Watersheds Trust, Case New Holland, River Network, Racine Community Foundation, WI Energy Foundation, Wild Ones-Root River Chapter, and individual donors.

With Rich Gossling retiring, the candidates for Village President were Ruth Atwood and Mike Farrell. The candidates who ran for Village Trustee were: Sharon Calvillo, Colleen Fisch, Bill Glembocki, Lisa Hendricks, John McCabe and Jack Spencer.

Mike Farrell was elected Village President and the top three vote getters for Trustee were Colleen Fisch, John McCabe and Bill Glembocki. All were sworn in at the April 11th Village Board meeting. The Village Board consists of one president and six trustees.

Reminders from the Fire Chief Be kind to your neighbors when burning

Please remember to get a burn permit if you have not done so already. Remember to call the "Burn" line at 857-4063 to find out if burning is permitted for each day. You must also remember to follow the guidelines that are on the permit as conditions can change during the day.

New Law – Carbon Monoxide Detectors Required

As of February 1, 2011, carbon monoxide detectors are required for all single family and two-unit homes – new and existing – owners must install a CO alarm on every floor level and near sleeping areas. CO alarms are only required in new and existing homes that have any fuel burning appliance, which includes: stoves, ovens, grills, clothes dryers, furnaces boilers, water heaters, fireplaces or heaters or an attached garage.
