





Dalmatian toadflax: Prohibited except in Juneau and Bayfield counties (where Restricted).

Seaside goldenrod: Prohibited except in Kenosha, Milwaukee, and Racine counties (where Restricted).

Phragmites: Previously restricted statewide. Now prohibited in western counties, and restricted in eastern counties.

#### Notes on Phase-out Period:

The plants listed here were regulated by NR40, Wisconsin's Invasive species rule as of May 1, 2015. 'Restricted' plants on this list that were in the state as of May 1, 2015 may continue to be sold, transferred, transported and planted until May 1, 2018 for herbaceous plants and vines, and until May 1, 2020 for trees and shrubs.

# Notice of Rate Increase Water Customers of the Bristol Water Utility

This is to give you notice that the Bristol Water Utility will file an application on June 21, 2022, with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSC), for authority to increase water rates. Rates for general service will increase 4.5 percent. The increase is necessary to reduce the existing deficiency in present rates. The request is being made under Wis. Stat. 196.193. Rate increases granted under this statute do not require a public hearing. The effect of the increase for some selected customers is shown below. Public Fire Protection and Wholesale rates (if applicable) will also increase 4.5 percent.



If discolored water occurs run your cold water until it clears up.



#### BURN PERMITS (payments not available online)

Outdoor fires require a burn permit which is valid January-December. Please call the Fire Department Burn Line at 857-4063 for the current burn status just prior to burning. Permits can be purchased at the Village Hall during regular business hours or at the Fire Department nights and weekends. First time permits are \$25, and renewals are \$15.

#### **BUILDING PERMITS**

If you are doing any type of home renovations please visit our website and complete a <u>building permit application</u>. A <u>zoning permit</u> is also required in addition to the building permit if you are building a garage, shed, fence, accessory building, or adding on to a building.

#### CREDIT CARD PAYMENTS at the Village Office

The Village of Bristol is now accepting credit card payments <u>in the village office</u> for anything payable to the village. There is a convenience fee of 3%.
