Welcome to my June 2022 newsletter. I'll be updating you on issues being discussed at our Board of Trustee meetings as well as other notable events in our Village.

2021-2022 Budget

We just closed the fiscal year for period-ending 5/31/2022. I'm happy to report that final total expenses to date are \$19K (1%) under budget while revenues are \$42K (2%) over budget which should grow our unrestricted fund balance to

over \$300K. Once again, I must thank each of the department heads and trustees for their attention to detail throughout the year to make this happen!

Village tax bills for the new fiscal year were **mailed out earlier this month** and are **due without penalty by 7/1/22**. <u>If you haven't received your new bill</u> you can <u>view it online</u> or call the office at 845-677-3939 option 2 M-F 9 am to 3 pm.

We have received questions about the line on your tax bill, "Sewer Assessment", which is also called the "Sewer Special Benefit Assessment" or "SBA". The SBA is an annual, allocated charge totaling \$50K to all customers of our sewer service for fixed costs of the sewer plant operation and has been in effect for many years.

Proposed Upgrade to the Wastewater Treatment Plant

At our next board meeting on 7/13 at 6PM in the Firehouse, Delaware Engineering will present a plan to renovate our aging sewer plant. Once approved by the board, it will be submitted to NYS for a grant and low-interest loan request. Although we have started a reserve fund to partially finance this,

the total cost is in the range of \$7M and so we will be seeking multiple grant opportunities and long-term (30 year) financing before the project starts.

VRI News

Having recently been confronted with multiple cases of clogged sewer pipes, VRI, who administers our water & sewer operations, is asking that residents not use flushable wipes if they contain any synthetic materials since they can clog your sewer line.

Also note that if you leave for an extended period of time, VRI will shut off your water service at your request while you're gone & turn it back on before you return. If interested, call their office at 845-677-3839 to schedule this free service.

Bennett College Demolition and Conversion to Bennett Park

The Millbrook Community Partnership (MCP) leadership and their contractors deserve high praise for the successful demolition of the Bennett College buildings. This has already made a significant improvement to the southern entrance of the Village, but the future is even brighter. Deputy Mayor Contino has been working with the Town of Washington board on getting a charging station installed in front of the Town Hall, 10 Reservoir Dr. If acceptable to all affected parties, the station would be installed and maintained by Livingston Energy Group at no cost to the Town or Village and all revenues would go to Livingston.
