#### FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS



Congratulations to new Fire Chief Boscardin and Deputy Chief Granger who were sworn in at the April 29th installation dinner along with an entire slate of officers and board members. Ted Bownas was recognized for his 30 years of service which includes the past 13 years as Chief.

#### POLICE DEPARTMENT NEWS

After 50 years of police work, including 25 years employed by the Village, Sergeant Poluzzi retired this month from the Millbrook Police Department. We thank him for his dedicated service and wish him well in his retirement. Officer-In-Charge Witt is seeking a replacement officer to keep the budgeted shifts filled.

A Municipal Investment Grant of \$26K was submitted by OIC Witt and Trustee Contino for police uniforms, equipment, and training to better prepare our officers for issues like active shooter incidents.

Given the need for \$7K of transmission and engine work on the older police vehicle, we are considering purchasing a new vehicle, although this is not in the budget. We are looking at options and will discuss it further at the June board meeting.

With no input during the public hearing, at last week's board meeting we passed the updates to the Vehicle & Traffic code which we have been working on for over a year. While most of the changes were to codify, and thereby allow enforcement of, road safety improvements which had already been implemented, there were some additional improvements such as:

- Adding a weight limit on Harts Village Road.
- Increasing the nightly snow ordinance by an hour during wintertime.
- Reducing the "no parking" zone on Elm Drive.
- Adding a yield sign on Russell Knolls at the entrance to Front Street.
- Eliminating the 2-hour parking restriction on Franklin Avenue.

Signage to reflect these changes will be installed over the next few months. Although it did not impact passing the code updates, there were lingering concerns with school traffic on both Alden & Elm, and Deputy Mayor Doro and I committed to present a list of concerns and recommendations to the MCSD board at a future school board meeting.

#### **CLIMATE SMART COMMUNITIES**

Trustee Herzog is working with members of the CSC team at the Cornell Cooperative Extension to get Village certification as a Climate Smart Community, thereby making us eligible for various grant opportunities. At last week's board meeting, Gillian Mathews presented her assessment of the Village's Climate Smart Resiliency Planning and identified opportunities to improve the Village's disaster preparedness which we will convert into a prioritized action plan.

Later this summer, Gen Glasson will present the result of the Natural Resources Inventory action which is a collaboration with the Towns of Washington & Clinton. To inform the community about this activity and solicit additional volunteers, CSC reps will have a booth at the Millbrook Farmer & Makers Market on 6/25, 7/15 and 8/19, as well as at Community Day (10/7) to provide informational literature and answer any questions residents may have.

#### SIDEWALK PROJECT

Our plans to redo the sidewalks on the south side of Franklin Avenue from Front Street to Friendly Lane have been approved by the Dutchess County Department of Planning & Development. We now must get the approval of NYS DOT prior to going out to bid. Although we have received 2 Community Development Block Grants of \$100K each for this project, that is not expected to cover the entire cost and so how much of the project we commit to this summer (assuming DOT support) will depend on how much additional money will be needed to be paid by the Village.

Of the 20 trees along this stretch of Franklin, 5 have been deemed as necessary to remove and replace. We will post signs on each of those 5 trees this month to give the public advanced notice of why we need to replace them.


#### ARBOR DAY CELEBRATION
