

# Jefferson County Clean Sweep Hazardous Waste Collection

**Households and Farms: \$10 fee per vehicle - Registration required. Call 920-674-7430.**

**Businesses: Charged based on weight of material. Businesses must register two weeks prior to the collection event.**

**Types of Hazardous Waste/Chemicals Accepted: if the following words are displayed, "Danger, Warning, Caution, Poison, Flammable, or Corrosive" it should be brought to a Clean Sweep event!**

<b>GARAGE AND WORKSHOP</b>			<b>ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED</b>
Acetone	Paint thinner and solvents	Dry cleaning solvent	<b>No prescription/over-the-counter drugs.</b> Take them to your local police station or Sheriff's Office. Info below.
Artist's paint and media	Paint stripper	Fertilizer with pesticides	<b>No latex paint.</b> It should be dried out and tossed in your trash - fairly clean, empty paint cans can be recycled.
Antifreeze	Parts cleaners	Fungicide	<b>No vehicle, truck or tractor batteries.</b> Exchange at time of purchase or take to O'Reilly Auto Parts, Farm & Fleet, or Tractor Supply.
Auto body repair products	Photographic chemicals	Furniture polish	<b>No alkaline batteries.</b> May be taped at both ends with <b>clear</b> tape and disposed of in trash.
Automobile oil	Power steering fluid	Insect spray	<b>No Ammunition/Explosives.</b> Contact local police or county Sheriff's office.
Battery acid	Rust remover	Light ballasts	<b>No TVs, electronics, or appliances.</b> Bring to our specified recycling events – see web page for information: <a href="http://www.jeffersoncountyiwi.gov/cleansweep">www.jeffersoncountyiwi.gov/cleansweep</a>
Brake fluid	Shellac/Lacquer	Metal polish, solvent-based	<b>No sharps/needles, epi-pens, radioactive materials, oxygen tanks or medical equipment.</b> Check with Jefferson County or Watertown Public Health Departments or your clinic/hospital for disposal.
Carb cleaner	Stain	Mildew cleaner	<b>No propane tanks.</b> Exchange for full tanks or bring empty tanks to metal/scrap yard.

**Keep hazardous materials in original containers and do not mix substances together. Place materials in a box lined with plastic to protect from spills. Place materials in trunk or truck bed, not in your front seat.**

**Medication & Prescription Disposal: Pills – Creams – Liquids – Prescriptions – Over the Counter Medications – Vitamins – Pet Medicines – Inhalers** Drop-Off Locations: Police Departments of Watertown, Lake Mills, Jefferson, Johnson Creek, Whitewater, Waterloo, Palmyra, UW-Whitewater and Fort Atkinson. Empty all pill type medications into a sandwich size, sealable bag. Keep liquids & ointments in original containers and place in plastic bags or tape the caps shut.
