

Village Street Names

Here are some of our street names in the Village with their pronunciation and their meanings.

ANGELESY ROAD	(pronounced Angle-see). Anglesey is a northern island off the western coast of North Wales, Great Britain
BRANDY BROOK ROAD	Named after a brook that ran nearby.
BRECK ROAD	According to Mrs. Herb Schuster, it was named by her mother after a road she remembered when she worked and lived in Liverpool, England.
BRON DERW	(pronounced Brahn-dare-roo with a rolling "r" as in the Spanish "r" sound.) Bron means crest and Derw means oak. Bron Derw runs into Oak Crest Drive.
CAERNARVON ROAD	(pronounced Ku-narvon). The correct Welch spelling is with an "f", pronounced "v". Caer is a Roman word for wall or fortress and narvon is a river. Caernarvon County in North Wales is now Gwynedd County. The Prince of Wales was invested in Caernarvon.
CAITLIN CIRCLE	Dylan Thomas (a Welsh poet) wife's name was Caitlin. In Irish Caitlin is the name for fairies.
CAPEL LOG COURT	The first log chapel in Wales near Hwy. 83 and G.
CARDIFF ROAD	The capital city of Wales on the southeastern border.
CARDIGAN COURT	A city on the Southwest coast of Wales.
COLWYN BAE	(pronounced Col-win). Colwyn Bae is a resort area on the Wales northwest coast. Colwyn is a Welsh word meaning puppy. Bae is Welsh for bay.
CREGENNAN BAE	(pronounced Craig-eh-nen). Comes from a town on the water in Wales and means rocky bay.
CRIGLAS ROAD	(pronounced Creeg-lahs). The correct word is "crug" meaning a hilly area or growth. Las means azure color.
CYMRIC COURT	(pronounced Kum-rik). Cymric is the word for the language of Wales, Welsh.
DENBIGH GREEN	(pronounced Den-bee). A town in North Wales. Denbighshire is a border county in Wales.
DYLAN ROAD	(pronounced Dull-an). A masculine Welsh name meaning "son of the sea".
EIRA CIRCLE	(pronounced eye-ruh). A feminine Welsh name meaning snow.

Village Street Names (Cont'D)

ELIAS STREET	Named after William Elias who owned land in and around Wales. When the railroad arrived his widow sold plots near the depot which was the beginning of the Village.
FELIX STREET	Named in honor of Howie Felix, early Wales resident who owned the grain elevator.
GOWER BAE	A city in Wales on the Peninsula that jets out into the Irish Sea.
GWILYM COURT	The Welsh name for William meaning "will helmet or protection".
HEREFORD (Herford)	(pronounced Hair-eh-ford) A county near the Wales border.
HOLY HEAD DRIVE	(pronounced Hole-ee). A county near the Wales border.
LLAMBERRIS PASS	(pronounced Shan-bear-is). The double LL makes a th and s sound. Try putting your tongue in the roof of your mouth and blowing out both sides at the same time and you'll come close. The correct Welsh spelling is with an "n" not an "m". Llan means Church and in Wales is always followed by a Celtic Saints name.
LOCHTYN RIDGE	(pronounced Lock-tin). Loch is the Scottish word for Lake.
MT. SNOWDON ROAD	The highest mountain in Wales is Mt. Snowdon, 3200 feet above sea level.
PEMBROKE WAY	A town in South Wales.
PORTAMEL COURT	(pronounced Porth-amel). Means front porch.
SWANSEA GLEN	A City in South Wales.
SEVERN ROAD	The Severn River is a Welsh river that flows into the southern border between England and Wales.
TALIESIN ROAD	(pronounced Tah-lee-es-sin). Name of architect Frank Lloyd Wright's parents home in Wales. The home was named after a famous Welsh bard and mean "zenith of poetry", another meaning is "smiling brow". The house was built into a hill, which is typical for Wright's architecture.
WELSHPOOL COURT	A Welsh town near the English border.
WEXFORD CIRCLE	A County in Ireland.
