- Junior lesson students can also play 9-holes of golf for \$6 during the months of June and July, Monday – Thursday, excluding Holidays.





WINTER REMINDERS





OVERNIGHT PARKING IS NOT PERMITTED ON STREETS November 15 - April 1st. NO PARKING ANYTIME on streets when snow is visibly falling or streets have not been plowed.



FREEZING TEMPERATURES-When temperatures reach sub-freezing levels, plumbing along the outside walls has greater chance of freezing. Leaving cabinet doors open and faucets open enough to allow a trickle of water to flow, and installing insulated covers on all hose bibs will help avoid frozen pipes.



SIDEWALKS - Must be cleared within 24 hours of each snowfall. Remember that all snow from your property must remain on your property and not in the street or your neighbor's property.



ADOPT A HYDRANT- As snow accumulates, fire hydrants disappear. If you have a hydrant in your yard, please take time to shovel around it to make it visible and readily available in case of emergency.

Future Projects

900 West

We are looking forward to reconstructing 900 West south of Pages Lane. The project will include replacing water lines, valves, fire hydrants and water laterals up to and including the water meter and setter, followed by a rebuild of the street (road base and asphalt). We anticipate this project will be completed before school begins in August.

800 West

Reconstruction will also be done this year along 800 West between 1600 North and 1950 North, and 2200 North to 2320 North. The project will include replacing water valves, fittings and laterals, removing asphalt and rebuilding the road. This project is expected to take place in the summer of 2014.



FEMA Flood Potential Maps

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has the responsibility of assisting individuals and communities in the event of natural disaster. Besides assisting in the aftermath of such disasters, FEMA also has the responsibility to evaluate flooding potentials. The flood potential from natural drainages is shown on Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) for the more developed areas across the United States, including our community. The FIRM maps are available for review at the City offices and the Davis County Library. Anyone interested in reviewing the FIRM maps can contact the City.

Companies and marketers that send adult-oriented messages are required to screen their mailing lists with the State of Utah and remove registered addresses and numbers before they send their solicitations. Marketers that fail to remove registered addresses face felony charges as well as substantial civil and criminal fines. Shopping Local - What's In West Bountiful?

North of 400 N: While this area isn't a shopping center, the area between I-15 and 500 West is an important part of our business community. Larry H Miller Bountiful Chrysler & Jeep is the City's largest auto dealer and the Country Inn & Suites is a prime hotel/meeting center.

With so many great options, it is simple to see how easy it is for all of us to support our community by utilizing the services available in our City and shopping locally to keep sales taxes working to benefit West Bountiful.
