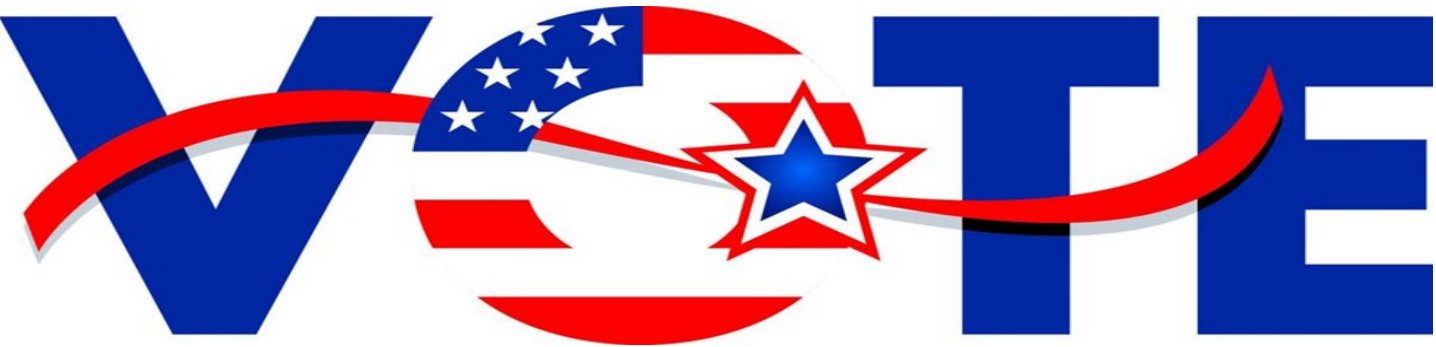

The City of West Bountiful is pleased to announce Brandon Erikson as the new chief of the West Bountiful Police Department, replacing the recently retired Todd Hixson.

Chief Erikson has served with the WBPD since 2012 and has 16 years of law enforcement experience within Utah. He has enjoyed fulfilling multiple roles throughout his career, including as a K9 handler, member with the US Marshals Fugitive Task Force, Investigator, Patrol Supervisor, and most recently as the Assistant Chief of Police.

Chief Erikson holds a master’s degree in management and leadership and a bachelor’s degree in business management from Western Governors University. He is currently an instructor at both the Weber State University and Salt Lake Community College Police Academies. In 2016, Chief Erikson was selected to attend the first world LGBTQ Conference for Criminal Justice Professionals in Amsterdam, The Netherlands, where members from 26 countries met to discuss the betterment of human rights for LGBTQ citizens in their respective countries and organizations, and he maintains a strong commitment to community policing and diversity within law enforcement.

Of the appointment, Mayor Ken Romney stated “Brandon has been an important part our police department’s great success over the last 8 years, and we couldn’t be more pleased to have him as the new chief. We believe his community-based approach is the future of policing, and we look forward to years of continued leadership.”

Winter Reminders

- Keep your trees and shrubs trimmed so the snow plows can make their way through the city. Trees are required to be trimmed to 14 feet above the roadway. If city crews find trees that do not meet this height, they will trim the trees and homeowners can be billed.
- Overnight parking is not permitted on streets from November 15 through April 1st. An exception will be made 2 days before and after Thanksgiving and Christmas.
- Parking on the street is not allowed at any time, regardless of day, when snow is visibly falling, or there is a visible amount of snow on the street and the street has not been plowed since the snow fell.
