A Primary Election if needed, will be held on August 15, 2023 and the General Election will be on November 7, 2023. More information will be posted on the website in April.







Community Highlights

City Construction Season

Here are a few updates on city construction underway or planned for 2023:

Public Works Facility: The new facility on 1200 N is scheduled for completion early this spring. This site will house the city's equipment and personnel that provide culinary water, roads maintenance, parks, storm water, snow plowing, etc.



Water Line Replacement:

This spring the city will be replacing the culinary water lines on 1890 North, 1810 North, and 560 West.

Residents on these roads will receive more information before work begins.

Road Maintenance: Later this summer the city will continue to treat roads with an seal coat to help preserve the asphalt.

<u>Sidewalks and Trees:</u> Several sidewalks throughout the city have been significantly damaged by adjacent trees. The city will be working to repair these areas.



The Google Fiber project has received all necessary permits, and their contractors are currently working their way through the city installing conduit and fiber. As the weather warms, landscape restoration crews will repair park strips and front yards that have been disturbed.

The City does not currently have information on when the fiber services will be available, but we anticipate services to go live for some residents by March or April. For more information, contact Google Fiber at
