Business:

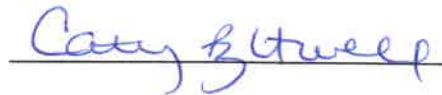
1. Mayor Pro Tem Noah Peterson called the meeting to order at 5:04 pm and welcomed everyone to the meeting.
2. Bo Bartholomew provided a thought and Spencer Lewis led the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Announcement:
 - a. Jen and Chris Jacobson announced they are resigning as Youth City Council Advisors because they are expecting a baby next week. The Jacobson's were grateful for their time to work with the Council members.
4. Christmas on Onion Street Feedback:
 - a. The Council liked the times of the event even better than in past years. The Council enjoyed not having to work around snow. The weather was good, and Santa enjoyed the event more. There were more people out from the city. The Council ran out of hot chocolate and cookies, so they need to plan more next time. The hot chocolate set up was better this year than in years past. The Bountiful Jr. High Madrigals thanked the city for letting them come sing. The Council discussed setting aside parking spots for those that are helping with set up. The Council discussed needing to communicate better about closing the activities for the singing. There was not a lot of set up time, so the Council discussed the benefits of setting up earlier. The Council also discussed having better organization for signs and Santa letters. The Council also discussed how to respond to Santa letters in the future.
5. Upcoming events:
 - a. Local Official's Day at the Legislature included an opportunity for Youth Council members to attend. As this is the first time our Council participated, the city limited invitations to high school kids. Elsie Buck, Clara Kagie, and Drew Farley are attending.
