

## Spring Clean-Up April 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, & 11<sup>th</sup>



Spring clean up will be held at the public works facility at **1410 W. 1200 N.** Waste drop-off is from **7am -7pm** Thursday and Friday, and Saturday from **8am until the bins are full.**

The city will cover the cost of green waste, excluding sod and dirt, at the Bountiful Landfill from Thursday, April 9th thru Saturday, April 11th. Green waste is accepted there year-round for a small fee.

### Items not accepted at clean up bins:

Lead Products, TV's, Barbed Wire, Chemical Materials, Explosives, Paint, Commercial Waste, Tires, Animal Remains, Appliances with freon, and Hazardous Waste.

### Notes From The Chief –

#### **Pedestrian Safety: Know the Law, Keep Everyone Safe**

Pedestrian safety is about protecting the most vulnerable people on our roads – our children, families, and neighbors. Understanding and following how right-of-way laws work is one of the simplest and most effective ways we can prevent serious injuries and save lives.

#### **What the Law Requires**

It is important to know the difference between a school crosswalk (marked with zebra stripes) and regular crosswalks.

For marked school crosswalks, drivers are required to come to a complete stop anytime a person is anywhere in the crosswalk. This applies during school hours and when school crossing signs are active.

For a regular crosswalk, drivers must yield the right-of-way to pedestrians in crosswalks. That means:

- If a pedestrian is in your half of the roadway, you must slow down or stop if necessary to allow them to cross safely.
- If a pedestrian is approaching closely from the opposite half of the roadway and could be in danger, you must also yield.

Drivers should also remember that if a vehicle ahead of you is stopped at a crosswalk to allow a pedestrian to cross, you may not pass that vehicle. Doing so puts pedestrians at serious risk.

#### **Safety Tips for Drivers:**

- ✓ Slow down in residential and school areas
- ✓ Watch for pedestrians at all intersections – marked or unmarked
- ✓ Be especially cautious at night and during poor weather

#### **Safety Tips for Pedestrians:**

- ✓ Use marked crosswalks whenever possible
- ✓ Make eye contact with drivers
- ✓ Confirm vehicles have stopped before entering the roadway.
- ✓ Make yourself visible
- ✓ Avoid distractions such as phones while crossing

Pedestrian safety is a shared responsibility. By understanding the law and exercising caution, we can reduce crashes and protect our neighbors.
