Due to dry conditions and low snowpack this year, the following restrictions are in place:

- **Outdoor Watering Season: May 15 – Sept. 15**
- **Water allocations reduced by 20%**

We kindly ask all residents to conserve water whenever possible and use water efficiently throughout the season.

**No watering between 10am and 6pm!**

### Recommended Watering Schedule:

- May 15th – June 15th – 2 days per week
- June 16th – Aug. 31st – 3 days per week.
- Sept. 1st – Season End – 2 days per week.

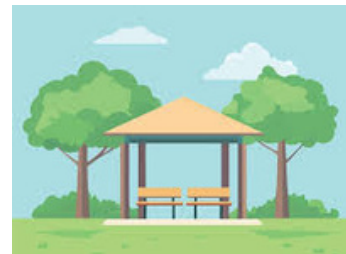

## Legacy Parkway 2026 Construction Project

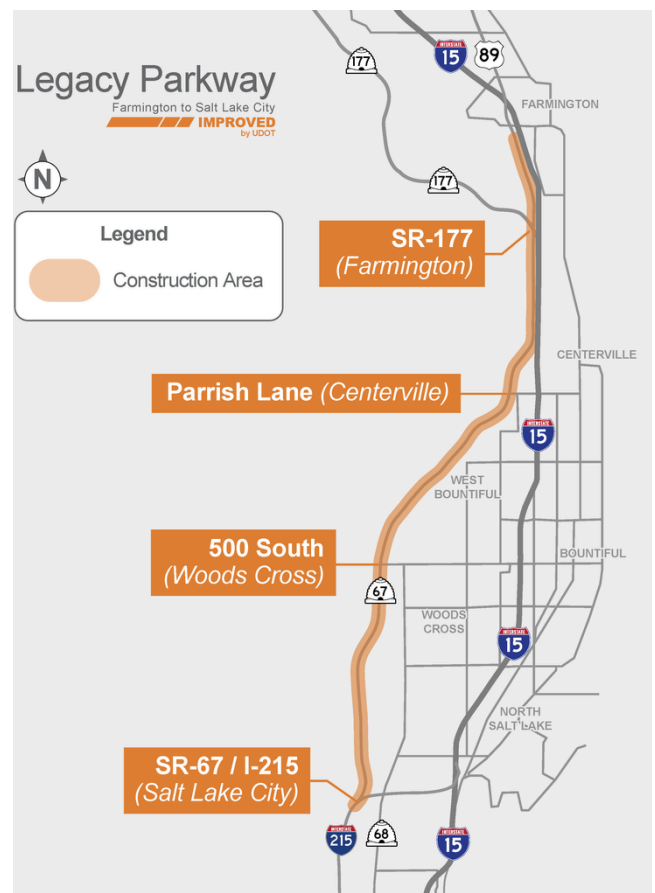
### PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) is adding a lane to Legacy Parkway in each direction from Farmington to I-215 as part of a comprehensive effort to meet travel demand through the year 2050. The lanes will be added in the middle, between the existing northbound and southbound lanes.

Construction is anticipated to begin as early as Monday, March 23, 2026, and be completed by the end of 2026.

### WHAT TO EXPECT

- Daytime work Monday through Friday
- Shoulder and median work
- Traffic shifts
- Increased dust, noise, vibration, and construction vehicle traffic

### Notes From The Chief –

#### E-Bikes Are Vehicles, Not Toys

E-bikes and e-scooters are becoming more common in our community, especially among kids and teens. While they can be a fun and convenient way to get around, they are vehicles—not toys—and Utah law now includes important safety rules for riders and parents.

Under Utah's updated e-bike law, helmets are required for any rider under 21 operating an e-bike, e-scooter, or similar electric device on public roads. Children under age 8 may not operate motorized e-mobility devices on public roads, and children ages 8 to 14 must be supervised by an adult when riding an e-bike. Riders under 16 may not operate Class 3 e-bikes, which can assist up to 28 mph. Beginning in May 2027, riders ages 8–15 will need either direct adult supervision or a state-issued safety certificate to ride without supervision.

A true e-bike is limited by class:

**Class 1** assists only while pedaling up to 20 mph

**Class 2** uses a throttle up to 20 mph

**Class 3** assists while pedaling up to 28 mph

Devices that exceed 750 watts or travel over 20 mph without pedaling may be considered e-motorcycles or high-powered devices, which are not legal for children to operate on public roads and may require a driver license and motorcycle endorsement.

Before your child rides, check the device class, make sure they have the proper helmet, teach traffic laws and safe riding habits, and remind them to ride slowly and courteously around pedestrians.

A simple rule is best: **helmet on every ride, every time!**

- THOSE **UNDER 16** MAY NOT OPERATE E-MOTORCYCLES OR HIGH-POWERED E-DEVICES ON ANY PUBLIC ROAD.
